Armed civilians detaining migrants

ACLU wants groups patrolling the US-Mexico border to be investigated

In the middle of the night Tuesday, United Constitutional Patriots, an armed civilian group patrolling the U.S.-Mexico border in the Sunland Park area, detained more than 300 migrants who illegally crossed the border.

The group, who claim they are at the border to "uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America," is patrolling the desert near Sunland Park searching for migrants.

In a video livestreamed Tuesday on

Facebook by one of the United Constitutional Patriots' members, the group is seen detaining a group of about 300 migrants, including children. The video starts in the middle of the incident with U.S. Border Patrol vehicle and agents already at the scene.

In the video, the member repeatedly says, "This is an invasion ... and it is never, never ending" referring to the large number of Central American migrants crossing into the U.S. to seek asylum.

The group claims on its website that

Students get a taste of Texas history

Annual event attracts 750 fourth-graders

With the help of 45 presenters, more than 750 fourth-grade students from across Region 9 got an up close look at Texas' heritage when they attended Texas Living History Day Thursday.

The annual event is coordinated through the Region 9 Education Service Center and involved 16 different school districts in the region.

"We're real excited for them to participate in hands-on and interactive lessons and sessions that deal with Texas history," said Joni Lemley of Region 9 ESC.

The presenters come from around the Wichita Falls area as well as from across the state. They related facts of Texas history and heritage on more than 20 different subjects or individuals.

Topics included chuck wagon cooking and life on a cattle drive, the official Texas Longhorn herd, Fort Griffin State Historical Site, hand-made toys, cattle trail music, historic figures and the Red River Intertribal Club.

Cops: Teen wrecks mom's car as she's driving it

A Wichita Falls mother told Wichita Falls police she wanted her son charged with damaging her car, after he reportedly grabbed the wheel while she was driving him to school and steered the vehicle into a guardrail.

According to the arrest affidavit:

On April 8, 2019, shortly before 8 a.m., a Wichita Falls police officer was dispatched to a one-vehicle accident near the Kell West Freeway exit to Harrison Street.

The officer spoke with the victim who told the officer she was driving with her son to school, when they started arguing about his truancy.

The mother told the officer that while her son was sitting next to her in the front passenger seat of the vehicle, he reached over and grabbed the steering wheel and forced the vehicle to crash into a nearby guardrail, causing significant damage.

In the report, the mother told the officer that at no time did her son have permission to damage the vehicle and she is willing to prosecute for damage done

to her vehicle.

The officer noted that the damage to the vehicle was estimated to be in between \$5,000-\$10,000.

Javier Luis Vallejo Jr., 17, was charged with Criminal Mischief over \$2,500, under \$30,000 and was booked in the Wichita County Jail with his bond set at \$2,500. Vallejo was no longer listed in the jail Friday morning.
