Restoring oil output

Saudi Arabia says it already has achieved 50% recovery of production after weekend attack

Saudi Arabia's energy minister said Tuesday that 50% of its daily crude oil production that was knocked out by a weekend attack had been restored and that full production is expected by the end of the month.

The state-run company's ability to quickly recover from an attack of this magnitude on its most important processing facility highlights not only its resilience, but its importance as the kingdom's crown jewel.

The attack early Saturday struck a Saudi oil field and the world's largest crude oil processing plant in the kingdom's eastern region, taking out 5.7 million barrels of crude oil production per day for the kingdom, or about 5% of the world's daily pro-

Abuse survivor: I was trapped in lease

By the time she fled, the Gilbert mother was terrified her boyfriend might seriously hurt her.

He had yelled and thrown things, picked arguments and punched a wall, she said.

He had parked behind her car so she couldn't leave and cleaned his gun in



the driveway, she said. He once left

bruises on her arm. He was a former U.S. Marine with post-traumatic stress disorder, she said. Counseling hadn't helped.

"I slept with the fan off because I wanted to hear him coming upstairs," she said.

One night last year, he chased her during an argument and screamed until spit flew from his mouth. So she took her two daughters and left their rental house.

But she couldn't completely stay - no matter how much she

AZ sees 3 cases of vaping illness

Arizona is now officially part of a national outbreak of vaping-related

The Arizona Department of Health Services on Tuesday announced three probable vaping-related respiratory illnesses in Maricopa County. In all three cases, the patients were males in their 20s and were hospitalized. They have since been released from the hospital, according to information from state and Maricopa County health offi-

The department will continue to investigate other cases, said Chris Minnick, state Health Department spokes-

The Arizona Republic previously had identified seven cases of suspected vaping-related respiratory illness with two Phoenix-area toxicologists.

Execution lawsuit rejected

Court: Inmates do not have right to more info on death penalty drugs

Arizona's death row inmates don't have the right to know more about the execution drugs that will be used to kill them or the people who will administer the drugs, a federal appeals court has ruled.

The ruling by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit comes months after Arizona Attorney General Mark Brnovich asked Gov. Doug Ducey to help the state acquire the drugs needed to resume executions.

The last time Arizona executed an inmate was in 2014. Joseph Rudolph Wood was left snorting and gasping for nearly two hours before he died due to problems with the cocktail of execu-
