Porter County gets glut of health care

The newest hospital in Northwest Indiana will be built at the intersection of U.S. 6 and Indiana 49.

On Wednesday, the day Porter hospital announced it will build its promised new hospital midway between Chesterton and Valparaiso in Liberty Township, Clarian Health Partners and Lakeshore Bone & Joint Institute announced they were discussing yet another hospital.

These announcements follow an August story that a Mishawaka health care group and local physicians are looking at building a small hospital at Coffee Creek in Chesterton.

Preceding that, there was the July announcement that Memorial of South Bend would build a new hospital in Valparaiso. And that's just Porter County.

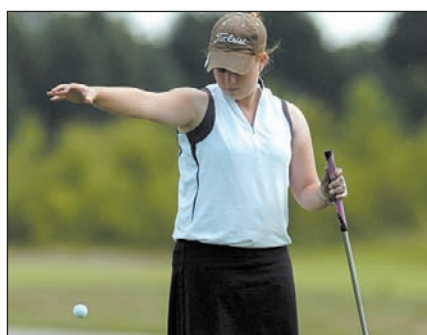
