## Clinton-Obama contest taxes voting machines

**MUNCIE** — The showdown between Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama on Tuesday helped to attract more Delaware County voters to the polls than in any primary election since at least 1972, which includes such past contests as Hubert Humphrey vs. George Wallace, Ronald Reagan vs. Gerald Ford and Jimmy Carter vs. Edward Kennedy.

Inspectors at some precincts said they lacked enough voting machines on Tuesday, a day of disappointment for 50 to 60 Wapahani High School students who mistakenly thought they were registered to vote.

## Long gets most votes for Muncie School Board

**MUNCIE** — First-time candidate Michael Long received the most overall votes in the Muncie Community School Board race, beating seven other candidates vying for three seats on the board.

Long, 51, an associate pastor and daycare director, came in first with 16 percent of the vote, followed by real estate agent Tom Parker with 15 percent, Beverly Kelley with 14 percent, and Beth Turcotte with 13.8 percent. Incumbent Kevin Smith came in fifth with 13 percent of the vote.

"I feel wonderful," Long said on election night. "I'm tired. I feel good — just God's favor and a lot of kindness from a lot of people."
