



## Aftershock of death and despair

HAITIANS PILED BODIES along the devastated streets of Port-au-Prince after Tuesday's powerful earthquake flattened the president's palace, cathedral, hospitals, schools, the main prison and entire neighbourhoods.

Up to press time officials feared more

than 100 000 may have perished, although there was no firm count.

Said President Rene Preval: "Parliament has collapsed. The tax office has collapsed. Schools have collapsed. Hospitals have collapsed. There are a lot of schools that have a lot of dead people in them."
