The moment felt historic, so Janet Roy wore her special T-shirt on Monday, the one that reads, "Capt. Billy Burke, Engine Co. 21, FDNY, We Will Never Forget."

It was the least she could do for her late brother, a New York City firefighter who died at the World Trade Center on Sept. 11, 2001.

"I never lost hope that this day would come," said Roy, of Pompano Beach. "I always had faith in the military."

'We need to be prepared;' Florida's airports ratchet up security measures

Florida's major commercial airports, like those around the nation, plan to remain on high alert indefinitely with stepped up but mostly unseen security measures, after the killing of Osama bin Laden.

At the same time, public rail systems in South Florida added uniform and plainclothes security officers on platforms and on trains, authorities said. For the ports, it was "business as usual," as they have run at a high level of security since the Sept. 11 attacks, said Ellen Kennedy, spokeswoman for Port Everglades in Fort Lauderdale.

At Miami International Airport, "we've ratcheted things up a notch," with increased police and K-9 patrols as well as random vehicle checks, said security director Lauren Stover. "Bin Laden's roots run deep into the fabric of our community, and we need to be prepared."

Security was also increased at Fort Lauderdale-
