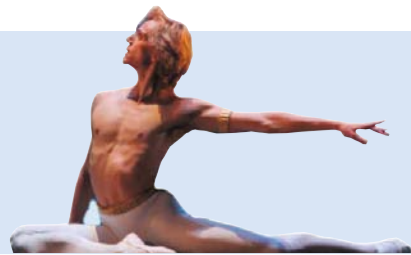

# DEATH BLOW TO TYRANNY

Libya celebrates killing of Gadhafi but faces challenge of uniting in democracy.

First, I talked to each man in lengthy separate interviews, asking why they said little in

the months after the death of Kelly Thomas and how the tragedy had affected them.

Then I spent several hours at a recall rally next to City Hall hosted by KFI talk radio personalities John Kobylt and Ken Chiampou.

While a supporter sold T-shirts emblazoned with a Fullerton police badge labeled "Termination Squad," John

and Ken condemned the councilmen for exhibiting cult behavior, for lacking compassion, for being inhuman.
