

Jay Moriarity film expected to generate \$200,000 in hotel revenue

SANTA CRUZ — Jahan Jaferian called 15 of his employees at 99 Bottles of Beer to work at 2 a.m. a week ago to help make the 1,100 sandwiches ordered to feed people working on the Jay Moriarity movie.

The Beach Street Inn & Suites hired three more people full time to take care of rooms booked for the movie crew.

Bob Pearson and his crew at Arrow Surfboards are

racing to build 138 custom surfboards to the specifications of actors in the film.

Those are just a few examples of how the Santa Cruz County economy is getting a shot in the arm from the filming "Of Men and Mavericks," which began filming last week.

Christina Glynn of the Santa Cruz County Conference and Visitors Council reports the movie cast and crew will book about 1,932 room nights before they depart.

GADHAFI ERA MEETS BLOODY END

Former Libyan dictator captured, killed by armed rebels in his home town of Sirte

MISRATA, Libya — Moammar Gadhafi, the former Libyan strongman who fled into hiding after an armed uprising toppled his regime two months ago, met a violent and vengeful death Thursday in the hands of rebel fighters who stormed his final stronghold in Sirte, his Mediterranean hometown. At least one of his sons was also killed.

Al-Jazeera television showed footage of Gadhafi, bloodied but still alive, as he was dragged around by armed men in Sirte. The network also broadcast a separate clip of his upper body, partly stripped, with eyes staring vacantly and an apparent gunshot wound to the head, as jubilant fighters fired automatic weapons in the air. A third video, posted on YouTube, showed excited fighters hovering around

TYLER TENORIO HOMICIDE

Trio to face jury trial in teen's slaying

SANTA CRUZ — Despite potential alibis for one of the three defendants charged in the killing of Santa Cruz teen Tyler Tenorio, a judge ruled Thursday that all three men will face a trial in part because of a lower standard of proof needed in a preliminary hearing.

Pasqual Reyes, Daniel Onesto and Walter Escalante were held to answer Thursday on charges

of murder and participating in a street gang in Tenorio's death.

Judge Paul Marigonda said the 3½-week preliminary hearing illuminated details of the fight that led to Tenorio's death and ruled there was sufficient evidence to hold them. Marigonda cited witnesses who initially told police that they saw Onesto near the fight, and he said fingerprints found on beer cans at the Chestnut Street apartments matched

Cellphones and cancer: Don't worry, your device is probably safe

LONDON — Danish researchers can offer some reassurance if you're concerned about your cellphone: Don't worry. Your device is

probably safe.

The biggest study ever to examine the possible connection between cellphones and cancer found no evidence of any link, suggesting that

billions of people who are rarely more than a few inches from their phones have no special health concerns.

The Danish study of more than 350,000 people concluded there was no difference in cancer rates between people who had used a cellphone

for about a decade and those who did not.

Last year, a separate large study found no clear connection between cellphones and cancer. But it showed a hint of a possible asso-
