

City leaders say they'll take time in replacing the late Tom Salm

The North Liberty City Council paid tribute to late Mayor Tom Salm in its first meeting since his death, and officials say they're in no hurry to fill his empty seat moving forward.

The council passed a resolution at its Tuesday meeting honoring Salm, the city's mayor of seven years, following his death May 18 of a heart attack. City Administrator Ryan Heiar said a framed copy of the resolution will be passed on to the former mayor's family.

Mayor Pro Tem Gerry Kuhl led the meeting and will serve as acting mayor for the foreseeable fu-
