Kane jury files unsealed

COURTHOUSE » Only a few hours after an attorney for embattled Attorney General Kathleen Kane asked the supervising judge of a state-wide grand jury to unseal the investigative grand jury's presentment against Kathleen

Kane, the presentment was unsealed and filed in the Montgomery County Clerk of Courts' office. In court on Monday, defense attorney Gerald Shargel asked Judge William Carpenter to unseal the investigative Grand Jury's presentment while arguing that Kane should not be subject to an indirect criminal contempt hearing.

Unsealing the documents confirms what has already been widely reported by news outlets across the state — the investigating grand jury has recommended charges be filed against Kane. Though it has been reported, the details of the grand jury's investigation have not been made public until now.

Trucks crash: Chemicals set aflame, sewage drains into creek
Officials: Traffic could be affected up to 24 hours later

LOWER PROVIDENCE » One person is dead after a tractor-trailer and a tanker truck collided in the 700 block of

South Park Avenue Monday morning.

Lower Providence police, firefighters and emergency services were dispatched to the scene shortly before 6 a.m. and the Montgomery County Hazardous Materials Response Team was called in due to

leakage of a white powder from drums inside the trailer container. The powder — later identified as Aquabeads 915, a smoothing agent used in cosmetics — was subsequently determined to be non-hazardous.

According to Lower Providence Police Chief Francis Car-

roll, the trailer collided head on with the tanker, which contained sewage bound for a treatment plant in Schuylkill Township. At some point, the trailer carrying the powder became separated from its cab and ruptured.

LIMERICK » Township police have arrested a man on charges of illegally selling a firearm to a known felon.

Anthony Gondar, 41, of Douglassville, was arrested after police followed up on the firearms found in the April 6 arrest of a man parked outside of the Wawa on Ridge Pike. Police are not releasing the name of that man due to an ongoing investigation.

Officer Chris Iochum and Detective Pat Roche tracked the serial numbers of the two loaded handguns found on the man who was discovered passed out in the Wawa parking lot, police said. The man was found with a 9 mm handgun and a 22 mm handgun, along with an ample stash of drugs.
