MillerCoors adopts Trenton Brewery's practices to reuse, recycle nearly all waste at its U.S. breweries.

ST. CLAIR TWP. — All eight major MillerCoors breweries in the U.S. are now landfill free as of the new year, but the practices used to achieve the environmentally friendly status originated from lessons learned here in Butler County where the Trenton Brewery was the first to reach the milestone by 2011, according to the company.

When MillerCoors Trenton Brewery, located just outside the city in St. Clair Twp. on

Wayne Madison Road, became landfill-free, it meant 99.8 percent of employee and process waste was reused or recycled such as aluminum, glass and cardboard. This is still true today. The rest of the waste including floor sweepings goes to a place in Indiana where it is burned for energy.

Now instead of filling a landfill, more than 200 million pounds of waste a year is recycled from the Trenton Brewery, said Denise Quinn, plant manager and vice president

homes and assisted-living facilities in our nine-county region fared well. More than half scored above the state

average in a resident satisfaction survey that drew on the feedback of nearly 50,000 seniors.

Residents of senior living facilities answered 45 questions in confidence in the Ohio Department of Aging survey, which was conducted from August to December 2015. Their feedback indicated that facilities can improve by building stronger relationships between staff and residents; make staff more avail-

Kasich kicks off Ohio push

Governor wins support from Schwarzenegger in must-win effort.

COLUMBUS — In his battle to stop Donald Trump and stay in the presidential race, Ohio Gov. John Kasich enlisted the help of muscle man-turned-movie-star-turned-politician — Arnold Schwarzenegger, aka The Governor.

Schwarzenegger, who was in Columbus for his annual sports festival, endorsed Kasich on Sunday during a campaign rally held just 10 days before Kasich's must-win primary contest in his home state on March 15.

If Kasich fails to beat Trump here, his campaign is likely finished. But if he wins the Buckeye state contest, Kasich will continue to maneuver for a shot at winning the GOP nomination — possibly through a brokered convention in Cleveland in July.
