WORLD ABSORBS SHOCK OF UK VOTE

Cameron to resign; markets reel

LONDON — Britain has jumped. Now it is wildly searching for the parachute. The U.K.'s unprecedented decision to leave the European Union sent shockwaves through the country and around the world Friday, rocking financial markets,

toppling Prime Minister David Cameron and even threatening the ties that bind the United Kingdom.

Britons absorbed the overwhelming realization that their anti-establishment vote has pushed the British economy into treacherous and uncertain territory and sparked a profound crisis for a bloc founded to unify Europe after the devastation of World War II.

"Leave" campaigners hailed the result as a victory

for British democracy against the bureaucratic behemoth of the EU.

Conservative former London Mayor Boris Johnson said "the British people have spoken up for democracy in Britain and across Europe," while Nigel Farage, leader of the hard-right U.K. Independence Party, said "the dawn is breaking on an independent United Kingdom."

But for the 48 percent of

Ayotte presents service medals to Vietnam vet's widow

PORTSMOUTH — U.S. Sen. Kelly Ayotte, R-N.H., presented the wife of a late Air Force veteran with multiple medals he never received while he was still alive.

Ayotte noted that Master Sgt. Andrew Stanley Zuba "served our country with great distinction and

Sand sculptures vandalized

World-class artists completed works for competition

HAMPTON — Police are investigating the vandalism of four sand sculptures following the 16th annual Hampton Beach Master Sand Sculpting Classic. The damage is believed to have occurred early Friday morning.

David Gooch, head of security for the sand sculptures, said the act must have occurred between 1:30 and 6 a.m., when he was not on site. Guards monitor the sculptures 24 hours a day, seven days a week. He said he has not yet heard from the guard who was on duty

this morning. Deputy Police Chief David Hobbs said his department is investigating the incident.

The sand sculpting competition, which concluded June 18, is considered one of the biggest tourist attractions for Hampton Beach. Gooch said many people come from Canada to see the competition and many of the world-class sculptors are from Canada.

"She Loves Me," this year's People's Choice award winning sculpture by Justin Gordon of Groveland, Massachusetts, depicts an ogre playing a game of "she loves me, she loves me not" with a flower. The ogre's face was completely removed.




