PHILADELPHIA » After she spent an hour applying for the biggest executive job in the world, the glass ceiling broke and the balloons descended on Hillary Clinton.

They fell over Ava McElmurray, a 6-year-old from New York. They fluttered at the feet of 12-year-old Ada Kaine Eveyln-Jack, sitting with her mother amid the California delegation.

Their mothers wanted them to be here for the Democratic National Convention on Thursday, to feel the full weight of history — and to hear as Clinton offered a detailed, sometimes playful contrast to Donald Trump's pledge to lift the country by force of personality.

"Americans don't say 'I alone can fix it,'" Clinton said, quoting Trump's speech. "They say, 'We can fix it together!'"

Increase of West Nile virus in county

More mosquitoes found that are carrying bug

In a Sun Valley neighborhood where riders guide their horses down dusty roads and roosters crow from gated front yards, mosquito expert Ronnie Helo armed himself with a pile of pamphlets and a familiar warning.

West Nile virus was increasing in the area, he told resident who opened their doors to him early Thursday morning. Helo, a senior specialist with the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District, wanted people to be aware.

SANTA CLARITA

Cost to fight Sand fire estimated at \$28 million

SANTA CLARITA » A new number emerged Thursday as firefighters worked to encircle the deadly Sand fire that has charred more than 38,000 acres near Santa Clarita and was 65 percent contained: \$28 million.

That's the projected total cost of the deadly blaze, which required dozens of helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft and what looked like a small city hosting thousands of firefighters from across the state, said Justin Correll, a spokesman for the federal Interagency Incident Management Southern California Team 3, or unified command.

Nearly 2,800 firefighters still worked in steep terrain to knock down the blaze that broke out in the afternoon July 22 near Sand
