# CLINTON VOWS STEADY HAND

## The Democratic nominee for president says she’s a unifier for the divided times we face

**PHILADELPHIA** — Promising Americans a steady hand, Hillary Clinton cast herself Thursday night as a unifier for divided times, steered for a volatile world by decades in politics that have left some Americans skeptical of her character.

“I will be a president for Democrats, Republicans, independents, for the struggling, the striving and the successful. For those who vote for me

and those who don’t,” Clinton said as she accepted the Democratic nomination, becoming the first woman to lead a major U.S. political party.

She drew a sharp contrast with her general election rival Donald Trump, calling the Republican supremely unqualified for the White House.

“Imagine him in the Oval Office facing a real crisis,” she said. “A man you can bait with a tweet is not a man we can trust with nuclear weapons,” she

At least we hope it’s A. That’s the restaurant’s sanitation grade, and most local facilities have A’s, according to the Guilford County Department of Health

In addition to the letter grade and numerical score, the database includes inspector comments, most of which correspond to sections of the N.C. Food Code Manual. The state regulation is modeled on the U.S. Food and Drug Administration’s 2009 Food Code.
